What our classes are doing this term:

Reception

Next term in Reception our topic will be 'Fairy-tales'. We will answer the questions 'Who is my hero and what do they do? Our class text will be 'George and the Dragon' by Chris Wormell and we will discuss who our favourite heroes are and what special things they can do. We will share some of our best loved traditional tales and talk about what stories our adults enjoyed as children. We will find out about England's Patron, Saint George and learn about how everyday heroes like fire fighters look after us. We will explore and recreate some of the work of the artist Jackson Pollock and discuss the upcoming coronation of King Charles.

V---4

In maths, we will be focusing on counting in twos, fives and tens and explore multiplication and division through grouping and sharing. Our English work will include free verse poetry and narrative writing based on Traction Man. In Science, we will identify and name a variety of common animals that are birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles and mammals. We will use our science knowledge on our school trip when we explore the animals at Smithills Open Farm at the end of the half term.

Our Computing sessions will be linked to programming. Children will use positional language to programme a floor robot to follow a planned route. Social skills will continue to be an important part of our year 1 curriculum to develop skills such as resilience, independence and communication.

Vear 2

This half term, we will be focusing on fractions in our maths sessions. In English, we will be continuing to read The Tin Forest by Helen Ward and writing a diary entry and a recount. Children will continue learning about how plants grow and also start to explore habitats and living things in science. In art, we will continue work on drawing and in DT we will be preparing fruit and veaetables.

In our PE sessions we will be focusing on competitive games. We will continue our learning about India in our geography topic, and will begin to learn about the Victorians in our history lessons towards the end of this half term. Our Computing topic is e-safety, and the children will explore in more detail how to be safe online.

In music, we will learn a new song 'The Sunshine Song' and we will play instruments with this. Our RE topic is 'How do we celebrate special and sacred times?', which will run over the whole Summer term. We will also complete a range of activities linked to the Coronation.

Year 3

In year 3 this term our whole class novel is The Abominables by Eva Ibbotson. We will be using this book to write our own exciting adventure stories. In Maths we will be continuing to explore fractions and money. In humanities we will explore rivers, coasts and mountains of the world and begin to look more in depth at North America. In Design and technology we are learning about pneumatics and seasonal eating and finishing off our programming using scratch in computing. In science we will be completing our states of matter topic with some exciting investigations and then moving onto electricity. We are hoping for some dry weather so we can develop our outdoor adventure skills and work on our orienteering in PE.

Voor 3/4

In Maths we will continue with our fractions unit, working on adding and subtracting fractions before moving onto decimal numbers. Our class book this half term is 'Malamander'. We will be writing senses poems.

Our science topic this half term is electricity. We will identify which appliances run on electricity, construct circuits and learn about conductors and insulators. In Geography our topic this half term is Rivers, Coasts and Mountains of the world. In PE, we will be focusing on cricket.

Year 4/5

This half term we will be looking forward to celebrating the historical coronation event. Our book for the rest of the term is called 'The House with Chicken Legs' which will provide us with some super writing opportunities. Year 4 science is electricity and Year 5s are looking at living things and their habitats. We are also going to be designing a steady hand game linked to electricity. We are going to work with Mr. Chesterman and learn some great songs and actions. In computing we are hoping to develop our website skills! In PE we will be working on our cricketing skills.

Year 5/6

This half-term in Year 5/6 Juniper we will be learning about the causes of World War One and exploring what life was like for the soldiers on the Western front. Our class novel this half-term, War Horse by Michael Morpurgo, is linked to our History topic. In maths, we will be multiplying fractions, learning about decimals and percentages, and analysing statistics. Children will be learning about electricity in Science and will be designing and making a game using electrical components as part of DT.

Year (

Year 6 are currently working hard on preparing for SATS. We wish them all the very best of luck with their tests, but hope that our children know that they are more than a test result. They also have the residential to look forward. Our class novel for the Summer Term is The Journey to the River Sea by Eva Ibbotson. We will be learning about the causes of World War One and exploring what life was like for the soldiers on the Western front. This included children working as civil engineers testing different shaped towers to find the strongest, testing wool and manmade fibres for waterproofing and exploring chromatography.


